

Another great event happened during the month of April was the "Spring festival" organized by the Pakistan section. It was first of its kind at RAHRC, All 1100 tickets sold out- with many people on the day were asking for more tickets; More than 1300 people attended the festival whereby all were served with variety of food that includes 7 snacks dishes. The festival had full of activities for both families and kids

including kites, paddle boats, football, robin hood cricket etc. plus Raffle draw and gifts- Free kites/t-shirts to all. It was really appreciated by all attendees. "Well done to the Pakistan section"!

The month of April 2015 also presented the first "ZUMBAthon" in Oman which took place on 24th April at the Sports hall with more than 200 participants. The event run over 3 hours of continuous Zumba sessions starting at 3pm and successfully ended at 6:00pm. This event was organized by licensed Zumba instructors and was supported by the RAH Fitness Committee. The funds raised will go towards the purchase of subsidized testing strips for diabetics from the low income people. It was organized as part of the Change 4Life campaign which helps in promoting health awareness and wellbeing for the community. All tickets for this event were sold out.

The event was inaugurated by Ibtisam Al Riyami, People and Change Director and a Change 4Life representative. Guests and members also attended.

Some safety precautions and advice:

If working outdoors you need to drink 250ml of water every 20 minutes. Do not drink water more than 1.5 liters (6 glasses of water) per hour.

Do not take any form of salt supplement until advised by a medical practitioner.

Recognizing Symptoms of Heat Illness:

- **Prickly Heat** Also referred to as heat rash, appears on the skin as tiny red vesicles (bumps) in areas continuously wet with un-evaporated sweat. Treated by replacing wet clothing
- Heat Cramps- Muscle spasms caused by salt loss and dilution of tissue fluid. Cramps usually occur during or shortly after work that involves profuse sweating. Treatment involves movement into cool environment and drinking fluids
- Heat Exhaustion- Generally a mild form of heat disorder resulting from dehydration. Symptoms may include clammy skin, pale complexion, fatigue, nausea, and headache. Treatment involves movement into a cool environment and drinking fluids

- Heat Stroke- Considered a medical emergency. It is the result of the failure of the body's cooling mechanism and can result in death if not immediately treated. Symptoms include hot, dry skin, confusion, loss of consciousness and convulsions. Treatment involves the rapid cooling of the body and immediate medical attention (Call 24675555)

Personal Responsibilities:

- Keep hydrated before, during, and after work.
- Minimize or avoid caffeinated beverages on hot days.
- Recognize your limitations and take rest breaks before excessive fatigue develops.
- Stay in good shape and exercise regularly.
- Get plenty of sleep.

- Eat healthy
- Seek and follow appropriate medical advice about your personal risk factors and how to work safely in hot environments

Cricket Section

Cricket Coaching is being done by OCC (Oman cricket club) coaches who are international coaches qualified by ACC (Asian cricket council). As per the request of parents/kids the section decided to extend the coaching up to 15weeks.Some actions are as below.

PDO RC League Team completed their final match of the season with a tough loss to B division team Sinha.

Opening batsman Nalaka Pathum slammed an unbeaten 100 (60b, 4x6 and 8x4) and claimed 3 for 25 off 3 overs to steer Sinha to a win and a place in the semi-final of the Khimji Ramdas sponsored Senior Cup T20 knock-out tournament. The match was played in the afternoon session at the same venue. Winning the toss and opting to bat PDORC were bowled out for 171 at the end of the 20th over.

Opening the batting Attique Mohammed top scored with a blistering 43 (23b, 1x6 and 6x4) whilst Donald Taylor chipped in with 31 (18b, 1x6 and 2x4).

Sinha did well to get to their target scoring 172 for the loss of 4 wickets off 19 overs and qualify to meet Z-Axis Media on Friday.

Canadian Section

On March 31 the Canadian Section welcomed a visit from the Canadian Ambassador for this region, Mr. Tom MacDonald, from the Canadian Embassy in Riyadh. He was accompanied by his head of Consular Affairs, Nancy Guy, and the local Canadian Consul for Muscat, Mr. Ali Daud. Over 60 Canadians attended this informal reception at the RAHRC boat club and had a chance to mingle with Mr. MacDonald and the wider Canadian community. Of note, the Canadian Consul office in Muscat is operational to assist in Canadian passport renewals and providing local information to promote trade with Canada.

There is also a Canadian visa office located in the VSF Global office in Muscat Grand Mall to assist people with visit visas to Canada – see the Times of Oman article <u>here</u>.



The sea was absolutely calm. The day brought along a soft breeze, and a beautiful golden sun, rising through the day warming up the sea gradually.

The wave height was set at 0.2 meters, and wind speed not exceeding 3 knots. It was yet another perfect day for the anglers in Ras Al Hamra Recreation Centre!!

A total of 10 eager fishermen joined the event in eight fishing boats. All the boats joined in from the Ras Al Hamra recreation centre. The anglers had only one thing in mind. It was to win the month fishing competition event. The score will also be used to determine the angler of the year fisherman or woman.

This event was very interesting many bonitoes were spotted few days before the event. For those who knew where to find them, it was an exciting game fishing day !

Many fishing boats were seen close to Darsait harbour later during the day, the spot was overwhelmed with trolling fish.

Since the water temperatures were still cold, it was a shallow reef day for the bottom category. Various fish were caught at 85 to140 meters deep reefs. This included hamour, few Andaq and red snappers.

Time, went past by so fast, and without notice it was already 1200. The boats had now to prepare the return journey to the beach of Ras Al Hamra recreation Centre. Failure to reach at 1230 sharp will mean anglers disqualification on late arrival!

At the weighing in!

The two teams of Salim Al Khatri-Faisal Riyami, and Hakeem Hassan and Suleiman Al Harthi had the heaviest bottom catch of 14.95 kg, and 10.95 kg. On the game category, Faisal Zarei-Jamaal Balushi team had nice bonitoes weighing 9.65 kg.





One of the features of the AGM is the opportunity to look back over the year's activities and review where we are. It was an extremely full year with the completion of the large Ocean Diver course started at the end of 2013, the new Sports Diver
