Judo section

It has been a fabulous start to the New Year with many of the players achieving their next colour belts. Since the end of November 2016, players have entered the 'gradings' (exams) demonstrating various techniques (throws and hold-downs) and fighting skills needed for them to achieve their next colour belt. The syllabus for this is provided by the International Judo Federation that enables uniformity of standard worldwide. The players practice for weeks perfecting the detail in each technique needed to be demonstrated, and to then be able to adopt this into the sparing aspect called 'randori'. The players themselves control the pace at which they progress, so the more they practice, the quicker the progression. It does of course become increasingly more difficult to obtain the next grade as techniques become more technically difficult and complex.

It is with immense pleasure that we report that all players that entered the gradings were successful and have earned their next belt – a testament to their hard work and effort - so very well deserved.

I am pleased to report that the club maintains a good membership and our weekly attendance remains in the 40 - 48 players per night.

I am also pleased to announce that since a couple of instructors left for personal reasons, we have managed to persuade Bruno, a French International player, to return and assist us with the instruction.
