Main Committee Message



Although May has already been a hot month so far, various sections are still organizing activities in and outside.

On May 1 the traditional Fahal Island Swim took place with a 125 swimmers participating and many more waiting for space to open up for them. The maximum of 125 swimmers is in place to ensure the safety of all swimmers at the start; it is not easy for the swimmers to find their kayak back. This year's event was also attended by a 2 enormous clouds of jelly fish and a very strong current that made most people swim more than 4.1 km and a bit slower than expected. As usual

over 100 swimmers took part and this year. However, despite the very calm seas, and apparently perfect conditions, relatively strong currents meant that most swimmers failed to improve significantly on their previous times—they may have gone quicker if we had told them about the shark we saw in the bay on the night dive the Wednesday before. Congratulations to everyone taking part.

Both boats were kept busy returning people to the beach who were unable to complete the swim and patrolling to keep other craft clear of the swimmers—fortunately no serious issues were encountered and better management of the ramp allowed us to recover both boats relatively quickly this year — we even managed to get a dive in later that afternoon!

We will also be running a second group of Sports Diver training shortly. This is a really useful qualification as it extends depth range to 35m (progressively), includes decompression diving and also provides training that allows the use of Niotrox mixes which will give you longer bottom times —if you have not signed up yet do so now!

All this is likely to keep our instructors extremely busy until later in the year but if you are interested in training—either as an Ocean Diver or to extend your diving skills and experience call in on one of our regular Wednesday meetings to get the low-down from our Training Officer—Louis Tsiakkiros.
