GRACKIN THE WATER!

Learned to scuba dive on holiday but it has been a while? Used to dive but haven't been in the water for years?

Now is your chance to fix that —RAHSAC (the Dive Section) is organizing a free "get back in the water" course for qualified divers who want to try diving in Oman. The course consists of one or more pool sessions to practice basic skills, followed by a dive with the club in our local waters. At each step of the way you will be diving with a qualified instructor so you can get your sea legs back in safety.

We hope that, having seen how great the diving on your doorstep can be, you will join the club and come diving with us more regularly—we have lots of opportunities to extend your skills and we dive every weekend and are planning some exciting expeditions this year.

The course is free, all you have to pay is the cost of a daily government dive permit (3 OMR) and a nominal fuel charge (1 OMR) for using the boat. If you need to, you can rent all your equipment from the club for 5 OMR (except masks and fins).

Hispanic Section has been busy planning and executing several events and initiatives.



Box Appeal:

The Box Appeal is a charity initiative run by Radisson Blu and Park Inn Hotels in the UAE, Bahrain, Beirut, Muscat and Cairo and the Radisson Royal Hotel Dubai. These boxes are then distributed to those most in need across the region. On September the Hispanic Section collected in 10 days a total of 212 boxes with toiletries for migrant workers. Donations came from PDO school kids, parents and staff. Also some friends of the Hispanic Section participated too.

Distribution of boxes was done by us at different locations: 125 boxes at construction site on Fouhood street, 49 boxes to PDO school migrant workers, 21 boxes to RAHRC migrants workers (OIG, Oasis, gardeners, etc) and 17 boxes to Carillion Allawi migrant workers at RAHRC.

Tango Night:

The Hispanic Section held on 23rd October at the Cinema Hall the first Tango Night ever organized in the RAHRC. The Cinema Hall was transformed in a way that approximately 100 people who attended this event were transported to Buenos Aires in Argentina. The RAHRC catering team did a great job of preparing traditional Argentinean food which included "empanadas" and "parrilla" among other delicious items. Professional tango dancers entertained the attendance by dancing and teaching Tango to the audience to the songs and live music played by the D'Clan band. It was a magical night that everybody who attended enjoyed. After the success of an elegant and different night the Hispanic Section will start offering Tango lessons to all RAHRC members.
