Golf Terms – What does it all mean?

Stableford is a scoring system in golf which, rather than counting the total number of strokes taken, involves scoring points based on the number of strokes taken at each hole. The objective in Stableford, therefore, is to have the highest score – unlike traditional scoring methods

Gross, or "gross score" in golf refers to the total number of strokes taken during your round of golf

Net score" refers to a golfer's score after handicap strokes have been deducted. Put more technically, the net score is a player's gross score (the actual number of strokes played) minus the strokes his or her course handicap allows to be deducted during the course of the round.

Better ball is a name for a golf competition format in which two golfers play as a team, but each playing his or her own ball throughout. On each hole, the two golfers on a team compare scores. The lower of the two scores – "the better ball" - counts as the team's score.

Stroke play, also known as **Medal** play, is a scoring system in the sport of golf in which the total number of strokes is counted over one, or more rounds, of 18 holes; as opposed to **Match-Play**, in which the player, or team, earns a point for each hole in which they have bested their opponents

The Course:

Ras Al Hamra has a 9 hole layout and is unique in Oman as the first completely floodlit Golf Course. Clever placement of multiple tees with large double greens as well as alternative locations create an 18 hole par 71 layout varying from 5,400 to 6,500 yards for which is great fun to play.

It was originally opened in 1969 as a sand course but has been redesigned as a grass course with established trees and native shrubs planted throughout so that the landscape resembles the barren and rocky feel of the surrounding Omani environment.

In addition to the nine holes it boasts its own floodlit practice area.
